Tonights show and tell was well represented on the tables as was our theme category "Cold War" allowing members to share a sneak peek of some possible entries for the upcoming show. Lets get to it!

Wes brought in several models to grave the table. An Italeri P-51A in North African markings. A splendid "Black Cat" PBY in night camo in 1/144 scale and a 1/350 Russian Typhoon submarine surfaced at the North Pole complete with sheet ice and broken ice! Well done!!!

Dave Horn also had several models on the table. The first was an S3 Viking in 1/48 scale by Italeri. An aftermarket cockpit and folding wing set made this one a definite attention grabber!! Dave also brought in a recently finished 1/48 Mig 21 by Academy and let us know it's a kit worth building!

John, one of our new members this evening brought in a splendidly built Typhoon submarine in 1/350 scale, kit by Hobby Boss.

Jerry a nicely done F-104 StarFighter in 1.32 scale by Italeri (its an Italeri kind of night!) dressed sharply in an Alclad Natural Metal Finish.

Kurt had two models this evening to show off several genres and his skilz!!

The first was Tamiya's 1/48 Mig 15 built OOB but with an amazing finish to showcase a weathered natural finish. Kurt was kind enough to share a link to a video sharing how he achieved the effect.

The other build from Kurt was DasWerks (Takom) Blitz kit for a 1/35 scale Panther tank. The kit was part of DasWerks "Blitz" collection which is designed for a modeler to knock out the build quickly.

John joined the crew tonight with a very nicely done Italian Arieta Tank.

Mark had to very nice tanks on the table for the theme build. The first was Tamiya's Abrams A-1 in 1/35 scale and a French LeClerc also in 1/35. To top it off Mark brought in a classic Monogram Viper from the original BattleStar Galactica series.

Ron displayed an extremely nice 1/72 Drone F6F in beautiful colors and sporting a set of Eduard Decals. Ron painted the canopy without the aid of a mask set and he didn't need one. Nicely done!!

Greg had two amazing builds to share. The first was a 1/72 Tornado, an AMT kit very nicely done and from his early days a 1/72 F111 in an amazing hand painted camouflage scheme. Both builds representing for the theme build.
